



The Audi Apprenticeship FAQs

Are you ready to electrify your future?

Whether you want to work with amazing vehicles and technology, or develop your customer service skills, the Audi Apprenticeship Programme opens up a world of opportunities for you to drive your career forward.

Want to know more about the programme? Here, we answer some of your Top 10 burning questions.....

How long is the apprenticeship programme?

A Service Technician Apprenticeship takes three years to complete.

A Service Advisor or Parts Advisor Apprenticeship takes two years to complete.

We will help and support you throughout your training and employment. In turn, you need to be ready to commit to the programme and complete your learning on time.

What can I earn as an apprentice?

As an apprentice you will receive full time employment in one of our Audi Centres. All apprentice wages are subject to the National Minimum Wage requirements. To find out more about minimum wages please visit: <https://www.gov.uk/national-minimum-wage-rates>

Will it cost me anything to become an apprentice?

All of your training will be funded for you by your Audi Centre or the Government so it won't cost you anything to complete your training with us.

Where will I learn?

You will learn every day on-the-job with the support of a mentor. You will also join us at the National Learning Centre in Milton Keynes for block release training. You will stay with us for a week at time where you will learn the skills you need to be successful in your role.

Will accommodation be provided?

When you join us for block release training, accommodation is provided. You will also be provided with all of your meals and even onsite entertainment such as a gym, swimming pool and weekly evening activities.



What qualifications do I need to apply?

The minimum qualifications you will need to apply for the programme are GCSE (or equivalent) grade A – C (new grades 9 -4) in English, Maths and Science.

We are looking for people who are passionate about Audi and can help us to drive our business forward. Take a look at some of the videos on our website and learn more about the roles available. Think about which role you want to go for and why. This is all positive information that you can use in your application.

What do I have to do to apply?

Just visit www.audi-ap.co.uk and click on the 'Apply Now' button. You will be taken to our online application form where you will be able to tell us about yourself.

This will be followed by 14 questions around numeracy and reading. Please take your time when completing the test.

Your full application will then be submitted to our recruitment team.

What happens with my application?

If there is an apprenticeship available in your local area and your application meets our minimum entry requirements, a recruitment advisor will be in touch.

When you get through to the next stage, our recruitment advisor will complete a short telephone interview to find out more about you. This is a great opportunity to shine and share why you want the role. Successful candidates at this stage are then shortlisted and their information is sent to the local Audi Centre.

Applications that are chosen from the shortlist, will be invited for interview. This is

the final stage in the process. Remember to talk to your recruitment advisor and get some top interview tips to help you succeed.

At each stage of the recruitment journey, the team will provide you with constructive feedback to help you improve your application and interview techniques.

What if I don't hear from you?

We receive thousands of applications each year to the Audi Apprenticeship Programme. Unfortunately we are unable to reply to each application individually but we encourage you not to give up.

There may not currently be an apprenticeship available in your local area so you might want to consider approaching your local Audi Centre to ask about upcoming opportunities.

What happens when I finish the programme?

At Audi, we invest in our people and we want you to build a career with us. Training doesn't stop when you complete your apprenticeship. You can continue to learn and become an expert in your field. You could also choose to develop your career further.
